Why Research?

Whether you are searching for a job, preparing for an interview, or doing career exploration—research is important. The benefits of research are numerous.

- 1. Being knowledgeable about a company/organization will enable you to write a better cover letter or introductory letter.
- 2. It will also help you prepare for the job interview by giving you the ability to answer the commonly asked interview question "What do you know about our company?"
- 3. It will help you write a skill based resume that focuses on the company/organization's requirements and corporate culture.

In career exploration, research will help you determine which occupation would be the best fit for you in terms of duties, trends, education, employment opportunities, and wages. This vital information will help you make an informed decision.

Search for information that will give you:

- ✓ in-depth information about a specific career
- ✓ up-to-date insider facts about a sector
- ✓ insights into the practical aspects of a career
- ✓ ideas about how to break into a career without going back to school
- ✓ the opportunity to determine if the cultural mindset of a profession will be a good fit for you
- ✓ information about the changes or trends in a profession
- ✓ the chance to start building your valuable professional network

In this guide you will find some helpful research resources. However, there are *many more sources for information—remember to think outside the box!*



Research Questions

JOB SEARCH

Here is a list of research questions. Revise or develop specific questions as you gather more information.

- 1. What is the company's website address?
- 2. What are the company's goals and/or mission statement?
- 3. What are the company's values?
- 4. Do the company's goals and values match mine?
- 5. What products and/or services does the company provide? Who is the company's market audience?
- 6. What key words, or "buzzwords", does the company use to describe its products and or services?
- 7. Does the company have a Facebook, Twitter, or LinkedIn? Am I able to locate the executive director's name, staff names or upcoming events?



- 8. Does the company have any current news releases? Does the company participate in the community?
- 9. Can I get a sense of the company's corporate culture from the information I found? Would that be a "good fit" for me?
- 10. Does the company have a Careers section? What does it tell me about the company?
- 11. Where is the company located?
- 12. Why do I want to work for this company?

CAREER EXPLORATION

- 1. Would I be good at this occupation?
- 2. Does my personality fit the occupation?
- 3. How many of my values are reflected in the occupation?
- 4. Will this occupation provide me with the wage I want to earn?
- 5. How many years can I see myself in this occupation?
- 6. Does the career have a shelf life?
- 7. Do I have the skills and qualifications to get a job right away?
- 8. Am I willing to go back to school?
 - a. How long am I willing to go back to school for?
- 9. Am I willing to relocate for a new job or to get more training?
- 10. What is the future outlook for this occupation?
- 11. Are there opportunities for advancement?
- 12. Have I contacted 5-7 people working in this occupation to get a real sense of the job?



Company / Organization

Research the company/organization website to find the names and contact information of hiring managers and influential people, complete list of products and services offered, and the mission statement. You will also find information on:

- future goals
- values
- history
- news releases



Visiting the Company/Organization

This strategy gives you the opportunity to check out the work environment and decide whether it is a "good fit" for you. To learn more about the company/organization, get copies of promotional materials available to the general public.







 - scroll down until you find the job title
 - click on the job title to learn more


